




LUAN PARLE ARTIST | SONGWRITER | MUSIC EDUCATOR (MUSIC)




MARK CROSSINGHAM UNIVERSAL MUSIC IRELAND MANAGING DIRECTOR (MUSIC)

Paula has spent over 20 years in senior leadership positions in the Arts in Ireland, including CEO of VISUAL and Head of Quality at Music Generation Ireland.



They were signed by Peer Music and their song 'At Last Our Time Is Here' was featured by Prince's Paisley Park in 1994. Since 1995 to the present day she's been performing as a solo artist, singer-songwriter, studio recording artist and backing vocalist, as well as arranging vocals for other artists. She embarked on her performance mentoring career in 2008, and was recruited to lecture at BIMM Institute Dublin in 2011, and promoted to Head of Vocals in 2016. In addition, she has worked closely with The Gaiety School of Acting since 2012.

Shelley's music career spans over 30 decades in Ireland with collaborations such as The RTE Concert Orchestra, The Ormond Multimedia Centre (Elevator), Bill Whelan (Riverdance), Gavin Murphy, John Walsh (Symphonic) Dave Barker, Bronagh Gallagher, Mary Black, Dolores Keane, Mary Coughlan, Mik Pyro, and Horslips, to name a few. 


SUE CULLEN MINDSET COACH | PROGRAMME MANAGER (MULTI-INDUSTRY)
